


Different Houses All Children Reading - Cambodia






My house is made of bamboo. My house is up high next to the trees.

My house is made of wood with tiled roof on top. I always play beneath the house.




My house is made of cement on the ground floor. My aunt sells fruit at my house.




My house is made of cement too, but it is on the first floor. My aunt opened a tailor shop at my house.


