Noi separated the fish. She put the big ones in the basket. Then she returned the small ones to the sea so they could grow into adults. She watched the baby fish swim away.




"There are six big fish, Dad!" Noi declared. "Two dollars for each big fish."



People started to come to look at the fish. One man removed the fish from the basket. "Where's the fish owner?" asked the man. "I'm the owner," said Noi.




The man handed some money to Noi. Noi started to count. "One dollar, two?" Noi looked at the man and said, "Uncle, you didn't give me the right amount of money."




"I bought everything. Five dollars is a lot of money," answered the man.
